Welcome to the 2014 Shodokan Open Competition.

The Shodokan Open competition, as always, is open to all Aikido practitioners from any organisation. This year, especially to encourage lower Kyu grades to competition, we have changed the events line up slightly. **Under 18's may compete in Embu only**, and as previous years the Randori events will be seeded by grade with medals for the highest placed Kyu grade in both the men's and women's events.

History of the Shodokan Open

The Shodokan Open started in 2006 with the aim of providing an open arena where Aikidoka could compete at the highest level of Aikido in a professional environment. We remain open to all clubs and organizations in Aikido and have been fortunate to welcome competitors from across Europe and South America. **Event
Programme**

EMBU (Events 1, 2, 3, 4, & 5)

Competitors can enter a **MAXIMUM** of 2 of these events only.

Two pairs at a time compete against each other in a straight forward knock out; the winner will be decided by three judges using flags and will progress on to the next round.

Event 1 – Nage no Kata - 5th kyu & below

The first 7 (omote) of the Nage no Kata

Event 2 - Randori no Kata (first 10 techniques) – 4rd Kyu & below

The Atemi and Hiji waza (10 techniques) of the Randori no Kata

Event 3 - Randori no Kata – 1st Kyu & below

All 17 of the Randori no Kata

Event 4 - Tanto Randori no Kata – 1st Kyu & above (2:00 min time limit)

All 17 of the Randori no Kata with Tanto

Event 5 - Goshin no Kata – 1st Kyu & above (2:15 min time limit)

The first 16 techniques of the Goshin no Kata

Event 6 & 7 - Individual Men's & Individual Women's Randori

As with previous years we will be seeding the Randori event by grade and will be awarding medals for the highest placed Kyu grade in both the men's and women's events. This means that the early rounds will have kyu grades fighting kyu grades only and in later rounds we will place dan grades against their own grade level wherever possible.

Event 8 - Team Randori

This is the final event and again will require a mixture of male (2) and female (1) competitors in each team. If you want to compete in this event but do not have a full team in your club then let us know and we will attempt to make up teams for the day.

All competitors must have valid BAB (British Aikido Board) Insurance. Please bring your certificates with you on the day. If you are unable to provide evidence, then competitors will need to sign a disclaimer or alternatively cover can be purchased on the day for £6.50 per person.
